Additional Comments:

The B. Arch program is only offered in its first two years [Foundation included] at the Beirut campus. This came in response to the growing demand by students residing in Beirut who want to study architecture to attend the Beirut campus. Due to limited facilities, only the first year was offered there since 2002, when the common foundation year was established, and expanded to the first two years in 2008, when growing demand led to the expansion. This need will be fulfilled by 2017-2018 by the projected full expansion of the program in its 5 years on the Beirut campus, with the dedication of the new Gezairi building.

The curriculum at the Beirut campus is the same as the one on the main campus, and the same standards are followed. Furthermore, a number of faculty members and visiting faculty teach on both campuses, thus ensuring the same standards. Proximity of the two campuses [30 kms apart] makes it possible to have this joint operation. Most lectures, exhibitions and events take place on both campuses equally.

The administrative structure is a joint structure, with one Dean for the School on both campuses, and one Department Chair overseeing the whole program, assisted by an Associate Chair at the Beirut campus. Major meetings are held on one campus [alternating] while regular meetings are held by video-conferencing.

All financial planning and budgetary decisions are made jointly with a proportionate distribution according to the student ratios on each campus. Hiring follows similar standards with most new faculty assigned mainly to one campus. This doesn't prevent cross-teaching when the need arises.

Faculty access to resources, as well as students participation in the school activities, is similar on both campuses. Currently, students enrolled in architecture have to move to Byblos in their 3rd year. This issue will be resolved by 2018.
