Introduction

SArD Strategic plans

The School of Architecture and Design has been established in 2009, after the consolidation of the programs in Architecture, Fine Arts, Interior Design, and Graphic Design into one school. The School added on new programs after its inception, namely Fashion Design and a graduate program in Islamic Art & Architecture. The School is now well-positioned to add additional graduate programs, namely a Master of Science in Architecture, Master of Science in Interior Design, and Master of Art in Graphic Design, which are all in process. The School is one of the most active at the university level in holding events, exhibitions, lectures and international collaborations, all of which aim at expanding the students' exposure to international trends in art and design.

The School is located on both campuses, Beirut and Byblos. It is composed of two main departments and one server unit: Department of Architecture & Interior Design, Department of Art & Design, and Foundation Program. The programs offered are recognized nationally and internationally, currently pursuing the National Architecture Accrediting Board [NAAB] accreditation for the Bachelor of Architecture program and the National Association of Schools of Art and Design [NASAD] for the Fine Arts and all other design programs.

Following the merging of the design-based disciplines into one single School in 2009, the School of Architecture and Design developed its first strategic plan in 2012, to plan its first phase of growth. The SArD SP I (2012-2017) <http://sard.lau.edu.lb/faculty-resources/index.php> set the direction for the development of the School in its first five years. The aims and objectives of the first strategic plan were largely realized, and on schedule. (for the SArD-SPI review refer to Appendix A)

The 2nd School Strategic Plan builds upon the first one to address several pending issues, as well as respond to the University's 3rd strategic plan, which was approved in Spring 2018. The main objectives of the School SP II are to maintain the School's growth and momentum, to raise the quality of research, and to respond to new pedagogical models in the design fields, in order to contribute to the success of LAU's Strategic Plan III.

SArD SPII General Directives

The goals that were articulated for the next five years are based primarily on the philosophical direction of the School, as a center for design education in the Arab world, with a drive towards international exposure and cross-cultural exchanges. The goals were also tuned with particular attention to the requirements for accreditation of all the school programs. The process of accreditation implied a revision of all academic programs, learning outcomes, and pedagogical methods. These goals are also based on the projections of new facilities, both in Beirut and Byblos, and the available spaces for expanding and launching new programs.

The goals and actions that are described in the following sections of this plan were thus drafted with the purpose of providing a state-of-the-art education for our students, one that responds appropriately to the guidelines of accreditation, while aligning the School's development with the University Strategic Plan III. Achieving these goals would require actions and changes that are specific to each program, but also a certain change in the educational culture, adopting more creative and dynamic models.

LAU SPIII Summary

LAU's third strategic plan (<https://www.lau.edu.lb/about/strategic-plan/files/lau-sp3-20170516.pdf>), will be serving as the university's roadmap to the year 2022. This strategic plan consists of three goals that constitute the three pillars of the plan. LAU's SPIII is aiming to place LAU as a leading regional institution of higher learning in teaching and research, as one of the key objectives of this plan is to raise the research stature of the university by increasing quantity and quality of its research without compromising on the quality of teaching.

Overarching Purpose

Strategic Plan III is focused on accelerating the move of the university toward positioning itself in the upper quartile of higher education institutions in the MENA region through enhanced intellectual capital, more and better research, pedagogical innovation, and moving towards becoming a University without Borders.

SPIII three pillars are:

1- Intellectual Capital and Knowledge Management

Includes capacity building in the domain of knowledge generation, accumulation, and deployment for the purpose of enhancing LAU's stature as a source of scholarly endeavors to a point that propels it significantly towards assuming a lead role among institutions of higher learning locally and regionally with clear global visibility. This pillar touches upon faculty numbers, intellectual contribution, research output, graduate programs, and leveraging our intellectual resources through internal and external interfaces.

2- Pedagogical Innovation and Integrated Delivery

This pillar addresses ways and means to enlarge and accelerate the already started process of pedagogical innovation touching all aspects of delivery process; course planning, classroom learning, and multi-dimensional assessment. It focuses on development needed by LAU to become a hub of creativity and innovation to sustain a vibrant learning environment whereby the entire university body becomes a community of learners.

3- LAU without Borders

This pillar seeks to put LAU on a path toward expanding its academic and professional impact beyond Lebanon into the region and further afield. Its crux is examining and recommending options for LAU to penetrate other national education environments through degrees abroad or foreign branches based on partnerships. Part of Pillar Three as well is to invigorate the already existing nucleus of entrepreneurial culture at LAU to make the institution a major provider of consulting services in all areas of expertise available within the university. While this pillar is initially intended for branding and positioning purposes, it is also expected to set the university on a course that will start the process of diversifying revenue sources away from the current overdependence on tuition fees. This will be humble and modest at first but with a real potential for picking up later.

1. Research and Publications

The School of Architecture and Design recognizes its deficiencies in the research capacity produced by its faculty. In order to improve on that deficiency, the school faculty would need to be encouraged in developing research projects and/or being actively engaged in practice leading to noteworthy and recognized design projects. As expressly stated in LAU’s SP Pillar I “LAU’s vision to become a leader in terms of intellectual capital and research...” SARd will pursue and support those research and creative activities across all its disciplines. One of the main goals would be to increase our research output and to translate that into published articles in international peer review journals.

Given the School’s potential to engage in community activities one should look beyond the classroom and studio, and have a particular focus in this strategic plan to include community-engaged research re-directed back to the classroom.

The main difficulty that SARd would be facing is the allocation of resources [funds or facilities]. To be able to support the overall goal of increasing its research capacity, the School will be expected to establish a supportive network, comprised of academics as well as engaged industry representatives, with the goal of strengthening cooperation with the business community, public and private agencies.

2. Educational Pedagogy

As conveyed in LAU's SP Pillar II "Learning, through effective pedagogy, is at the heart of the mission of the university". Faculty members are expected to participate and excel in the areas of teaching, research, services, and school extracurricular activities.

The faculty body within the School of Architecture and Design is one of its key assets, its diversity and teaching methodologies contributes strongly to its welfare and growth. Effective dynamic teaching/learning takes place when there is mutual faculty-student engagement in the classroom/studio. Design Studios form the core of all programs; where skills, abilities and knowledge are developed. Faculty are expected to monitor and regularly assess student performance, progress, and achievements in studios where feedback is provided on a one-to-one basis.

Despite initiatives to improve on teaching and learning more effort is still required, specifically in the areas of assessment, reducing plagiarism, and invigorating studio culture so as to enhance integrity and ethics, and strengthen the model of studio based education, which is a forerunner of the now celebrated 'active learning' that has become a requirement in all disciplines. On the other hand, supporting faculty development and promoting innovative teaching/learning initiatives will enrich the educational instruction.
